Provincial Basketball Teams at Nationals

The Provincial Midget (U15) Girls team defeated by Prince Edward Island 52 – 48 at the National Championships in Toronto ON. For Newfoundland, Hannah Jardine led all scorers and continued her impressive tournament with 19 points and 12 rebounds, with Kelsey Moore getting 10 points. British Columbia beat Alberta 62 – 43 to win the bronze medal, and Ontario beat Quebec 72 – 50 to win the gold medal.

The U17 Girls program was defeated 81 – 32 by the Saskatchewan team. Teresa Earles was the top scorer for the NL team with 11 points. Quebec beat Nova Scotia 78 – 73 to win the bronze medal, while British Columbia beat Ontario 80 – 75 to win the gold medal.

The U15 Boys Team was defeated 68 – 55 by the Alberta team. Mitchell Hearn was the top NL scorer with 15 points, while Daniel Foo had 13 points. Manitoba beat British Columbia 89 – 86 to get the bronze medal, while Ontario beat Quebec 82 – 77 to win the gold medal. Daniel Foo was named to the second all-star team for the U15 tournament. NL goes home finishing 6th, in a tournament of 11 teams.

The U17 Boys team didn't play on Saturday. British Columbia beat Saskatchewan 80 – 79 to win the bronze medal, while Quebec beat Ontario 86 – 75 in the gold medal game. The NL U17 team takes 10th place out of 11 teams.
